



RENO, NEVADA 450TH BOMB GROUP ASSOIATION BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 13, 2006

Meeting was called to order by our president Jim Strickland. Other directors present were: Al Goodman, John Shlapak, Floyd Perkins, Harold Saperstein and Courtney Shanken

Alternate director present: Norm Kanel.

Bill Conklin was in attendance as a guest. Nancy Jean Rellihan was present as the Patron alternate member.

Last years minutes were read and approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

REUNION: AL Goodman reported that we will be in Branson, Missouri (they cater to Veteran groups), October 3rd – October 7th, 2007. Milwaukee and Atlanta are in line. 2008 will be the 65th anniversary of our Group.

MEMBERSHIP TREASURER: Floyd Perkins passed out up-to-date rosters.

02-13-16 Email from Pasanisi stating, "I am still the Director of the Museum and Sra Greco is the secretary. Do not correspond with Pezzarossa. Building for Museum not ready; items are being carefully kept."

03-24-06 Email from Pezzarossa, "Children's Park is restored and ready for visitors. Veterans will definitely be welcomed to visit the Museum when it re-opens."

03-26-06 Email to Pasanisi and Pezzarossa that the 450th Board of Directors will discuss the date of our next visit to Manduria at our reunion in September of this year (2006).







07-17-06 Email to Pezzarossa which was a follow-up to the email of 03-26-06 concerning the current status of the Museum. No response from either Pezzarossa OR Pasanisi!

NOMINATING CHAIRMAN: John Shlapak got everyone's acceptance on the board to serve for another 2 years. He will present the slate for re-election at the business meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

Motion made and passed with one dissenting voice to give \$500.00 and place a plaque in two museums, Spruce Goose and the Palm Springs WWII Air Museum. It was the consensus to find out more about the Air Force Memorial in DC, the USO and the B-24 exhibit in San Diego. If the Collings Foundation will accept a \$500.00 donation, we would like the 450th name on the B-24.

NEW BUSINESS

It was suggested that the patrons establish their own Junior Board of Directors. A lengthy discussion developed to use our funds for the benefit of our members. 450th BG Tag Found in 2006 at Crash Site! — Do you know Them?



Inscription Reads:

IF FOUND RETURN TO OBRIEN JOHN F WALSH JOSEPH C 720 BOMB SODN

29-MAR-44 was a very foggy day over western Britain. At midnight on the 28th, an American B-24 Liberator, #41-11591, had left Casablanca in North Africa, on the second leg of a flight from Manduria, Italy to RAF St. Mawgan in Cornwall. Its mission was to collect some radar bombing equipment and return to base. The aircraft carried a skeleton crew of five. Also onboard was a Red Cross field representative, traveling from Italy to the U.K.. Unable to locate St. Mawgan airfield due to the fog, the Liberator was diverted to Fairwood Common. Having been guided into the circuit at Fairwood the Liberator circled in vain above the overcast; the countryside below was completely blotted out by cloud.

After numberous attempts to land, the aircraft's two starboard engines cut out from a lack of fuel. Pilot, Lt. Harvey Helmberger, then gave the order to bale out through the bomb bay doors. Three of the crew and the Red Cross rep. did so immediately, all landed safely near the junction of the North and South Gower Roads; They had infact baled out at an altitude of only 500 feet!

Sgt. Walsh, the flight engineer, refused to jump; Lt. Helmberger climbed back into his seat and try to crash-land the Liberator. Sgt. Walsh now in the co-pilot's seat, the aircraft passed over the airfield, it lost height, smashed through a wooden guard hut and came to rest with its nose embedded in the hedgebank which runs along Kittle Lane. Lt. Helmberger survived the crash, but sgt. Walsh who, had not fastened himself into the co-pilot's seat, was thrown through the aircraft's windscreen on impact. He died as a result of his injuries three days later.

If you know anything about these men, the mission, plane, relatives or any stories you heard, please let us know any details that may help in solving this mystery. Our intent is to help get this Tag back to it's rightful owner or family.
